

Don't give up! The Larkspur Library has started a program called Zip Books: if the book in question is nowhere to be found in the realm of books available in Marin and further afield,

AND if the book is available on Amazon, submit a request to the library for a Zip Book (a link to do that is at the end of this story). Zip Books = our librarian orders the book on Amazon to be sent to you, you receive and read the book, and you return it to our library to become part of their collection/catalog. Win-win!

Librarian Teresa Capasso says, "According to the State Library, the purpose of the program is to provide speedy access to books not available through local libraries. I think that's where the 'zip' originated. So far, we have received 40 Zip Book requests. We have made a few changes to our program since it began, and recently increased the number of requests per person to two at any time, and the dollar amount per book to a cap of \$75.
